Annual Report Update July—December 2012, Winter 2013

To put SICM's reports on a calendar basis, this is an update from July-December 2012.

SICM Sponsors a Summer STEM Program at Steinmetz Park

Building upon the success of prior STEM enrichment programs (Science, Technology, Education, Math), SICM conducted a one-week STEM camp and with support from Camp Fowler, a one-week camp. They were held in Steinmetz Park during two weeks in July.

Led by a certified teacher and assistant, the STEM program featured a visit from a reptile trainer, a visit to the Children's Museum, and daily learning activities. A new feature was the use of iPads. This camp was made possible by the Times Union Hope Fund.

A new camp was co-sponsored by Camp Fowler, which is affiliated with The Re-

formed Church in America. The camps were held in conjunction with the SICM summer lunch program, and some youth stayed later for the program sponsored by the Boys and Girls Club.

Held during the 4-day week including July 4, this pilot off-site camp in Steinmetz Park had campers participate in a variety of outdoor activities with the assets of the park. SICM is deeply grateful to the Rev. Kent Busman and Camp Fowler staff for this new initiative.

This activity was an outgrowth of the Safe Parks and Edible Playgrounds initiative, which has sought to increase activities for youth in all the city's parks. SICM, with Cornell Cooperative Extension's Roots and Wisdom Program, sponsored an "edible playground" (youth garden) also in Steinmetz Park. This garden was started by youth at Yates School in the spring as a teaching garden and then continued in the sum-

Update on Schenectady Damien Center

The Sch'dy Damien Center (SDC) was in the midst of transition later in 2012. The plan is to transition the program to become a satellite of the Albany Damien Center (ADC). Both serve people either infected with or affected by HIV/AIDS. Originally the centers in Albany, Schenectady, and Troy were one program but then separated. After a period of careful study and focus groups, the SDC Task Force recommended the shift so that affected individuals could avail themselves of resources available through ADC. The transition is approved by both governing boards, and together we are working on resources as well as improvements to the facility. The facility will continue to be owned by SICM. The SDC is open now only for special programming, including uses by the ADC, Mohawk Opportunities, and the AIDS Council. Any in need of services are encouraged to join the Albany Damien Center. For updates on the transition, contact Rev. Phil at SICM or Perry Junjulas at the ADC.

Jack brings a wealth of knowledge and experience from his work with New York State and later as a consultant in the areas of social services, health, and Medicaid. Jack replaces Crys Hamelink, who served in the position also after retiring from New York State government. Jack, as Crys, will assist and work with Rev. Summer Lunch Successful!

The Summer Food Service Program provided critical nutritional assistance to thousands of our community's young people at 16 sites. Under the leadership of Allison Williams, literally hundreds of volunteers, staff, and interns worked to provide 34,665 nutritious lunches to youth who otherwise would get a free lunch during the school year. Close to 70% of the youth in the Schenectady City School District qualify for free or reduced price meals. Therefore, the SFS program can have 'open' sites where all are welcome.



SICM experimented with three new sites: the Sch'dy County Public Library, Faith Deliverance Tabernacle in Mt. Pleasant, and the Front Street Pool in the Stockade. The SCAP summer Headstart program participated, as well. All new sites were well received and plans are in the works for expansion. Continuing sites included Friendship House, Faith United Methodist, Trinity Lutheran, and Mt. Olivet Missionary Baptist, as well as park sites (Central, Quackenbush, Wallingford, Hillhurst, Jerry Burrell, Steinmetz), and Sch'dy Municipal Housing Authority community rooms (Steimetz Homes, Yates Village).

While we celebrate about 1,000 lunches given out each day over 10 weeks, our concern remains that at least another 8,000 qualify and need the food. As the October <u>Times Union</u> article indicated, 50.8% of the children in the city live in households below the poverty line. For too many of the young people who come, it is not only the first meal of the day, it is the only meal. For 2013 information, contact Rev. Phil or Allison Williams.



Summer 2012 Internship Program

In 2012, 16 interns joined SICM for a full and exciting summer internship experience. 7 high school students and 9 college students were on staff and quickly became immersed in the many and varied programs at SICM and neighboring organizations, including Ham-

ilton Hill Arts Center, Bethesda House, and Home Furnishings Program. Interns were supported by the congregations of Union Presbyterian, First Reformed of Schenectady, St. George's Episcopal, Bellevue Reformed, First United Methodist, Eastern Parkway United Methodist, Grace Lutheran/Grace Ministries, Lynnwood Reformed, and Trinity Presbyterian, as well as the Rotary of Schenectady and the Business and Professional Women of Schenectady. Interns were an integral part of the Summer Lunch program, serving as Site Supervisors and Assistant Supervisors, lending a hand at neighboring organizations, and having a consistent presence in various roles at the Emergency Food Pantry. The students represented the following colleges and high schools: Union, James Madison, HVCC, College of St. Rose, University of Vermont, SUNY-Fredonia and Albany, SCCC and Wells; Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake, Scotia-Glenville, Niskayuna, Mohonasen and Guilderland. *Many thanks to all of our Summer 2012 Interns!*
